



Unit Aim: To recognize that God wants us love and enjoy His Word and be fully devoted to following what it says.



Woody's Welcome

It's important to know how to care for your pet so that it will be happy and healthy. Otherwise it could get sick. The best thing to do is learn how to take care of your pet the right way.

Some pets are harder to care for than others. If you live in a small house or apartment, or if you're allergic to fur it might be better for you to have a bird, fish, reptile or insect, than a dog.



Woody's Games

**Dog Care Relays** For each team, you'll need one of the following: chair, toy dog, dog collar, food dish, water bowl, lunchbag, plastic pitcher, leash and brush

Divide into teams. Place a toy dog on a chair at the other end of the room from each team. Put a dog collar on each stuffed dog. Under each chair place a dog's food dish, an empty lunchbag, a water bowl, a plastic pitcher, a leash and a brush.


For the first heat, players pour "food" from the bag into the dog dish and pour "water" from the pitcher into the water bowl.

In the second round, players attach the leash to the dog's collar and take the dog for a walk. (They walk around the chair three times, but the dog stays on the chair. Be careful with that leash!)

In the third round, players groom the dog, brushing each side and the back twice.

**Cat and Mouse** Players form a circle. One player, the cat, stands outside the circle. Another player, the mouse, stands inside the circle. The circle of players walk around the mouse. When the circle stops, the cat darts in to tag the mouse. The mouse runs around and between players in the circle, trying to avoid the cat. The cat must follow the mouse's path exactly. The two wind in and out of the circle until the mouse is caught.

Choose two new players and play the game again.





#### Guest Spot

Invite a knowledgeable guest to talk about pets. Someone who runs a pet store or someone who owns a pet can bring in an animal and describe what it's like and how he takes care of it.

This would be a good time to allow the kids to ask the guest any questions they might have. How does he take care of his pets? What's the most unusual pet he's ever had?



Woody's Checkup

Learn Psalm 119:97, then talk about the following questions.

- 1. What are some reasons why we love God's Word? (It tells us about Jesus. It tells us how to live. It tells us about heaven.)
- 2. What does "meditate" mean? (To think about, to consider, to examine) so what are we supposed to do with our Bible verses?
- 3. What are some of your favorite Bible stories? What verses have you memorized?



Woody's Stretch

**Doggie Bone** For this game, you'll need a dog bone or biscuit, a blindfold and a chair. Place a dog bone under a chair and seat players in a circle around it. Choose one player to be "doggie." He sits blindfolded on the chair. Another player is chosen to steal the bone. After the thief takes the bone and returns to his seat, all the other players shout, "Doggie, doggie, where's your bone? Hurry, hurry, bring it home." Doggie gets two chances to identify the thief. If he does, the thief becomes the doggie. If not, choose new one.
